The National Winner receives a plaque and monetary award of \$300 for their Phi U Chapter! Other cash prizes ranging from \$100 – \$200 are presented to Second through Fourth Place National Winners. Phi U also recognizes Regional Winners with a Certificate of Merit and \$50 cash prize. The 2022-2024 National Theme is "FAMILY: THE FOUNDATION AND LEGACY OF FCS."
