

From Us to You! Chapter Advisors Share Tips for Chapter Success

'Missed the last **Advisor Coffee Break** with advisors and National Council members? Here are some tips shared together which may help improve your chapter's success. Region Councilors are available twice a semester to answer questions and share important information. The next two sessions will be held in **February and April of 2024** – Join us for our **next coffee break on February 12, 2024, at 11:00 am Central Time.**

Here are some past tips to share with you!

#1. In addition to Greek Track, send meeting reminders via your chapter's social media networks. These last-minute reminders can increase member meeting attendance.

#2. If your chapter has several departments or colleges where members are eligible to become members of Phi U, seek out a co-advisor from another department to share the benefits of being an organizational advisor. Better yet, ask your student members which faculty would be a good choice and ask them to invite them directly.

#3. Need more members? Don't forget about graduate students who may be eligible on your campus. There are separate criteria for initiating new graduate students and remember to reach out to past collegiate Phi U members to stay involved at the graduate level. As active members at the graduate level, they would be eligible for Phi U fellowships and awards. Specify one meeting to focus on graduate students who can share their graduate school experiences with collegiates.

#4. Utilizing Greek Track and email for invitations for membership is the first step. However, some chapters have found that also sending a personalized letter (via email) has secured new members. Knowing your chapter is active on campus can be a great benefit compared to an online honor society. If most students are attending on campus, consider "tapping" them in during class time. This brings recognition to them as an honor student and publicizes Phi U too.

#5. Reach out to alumni in your area when potential students need assistance with initiation fees. Many alumni are very willing to support a student's national fee and/or chapter fee to make it possible for a student to join Phi U. Alumni can be contacted using the Alumni Greek Track feature for each specific chapter.

#6. Honor cords, stoles, violet points... Review your chapter's policy on who can receive honor cords or stoles. This can be motivation for members to stay active and seek a leadership position with your chapter. Some chapters use "Violet Points" to earn hours towards meetings, community service, and social events to earn chapter cords or stoles which can be worn at graduation and/or graduation photographs!

#7. Founders' Day, February 10th is just around the corner. Remind your chapter officers to think of a simple recognition for members and faculty to honor the history of Phi U. Large or small, this event can help unite members and alumni together.

Getting on track with Greek Track

Have you noticed that emails that are generated from Greek Track look a little different than those generated through Outlook and other traditional email platforms? Your regional councilor and others on the national board may be emailing advisors and chapter officers through Greek Track as we start using Greek Track for more and more functions of our honor society. You may want to email chapter members this way as well as their email addresses are all in Greek Track and you can easily generate an email without worry of accidentally leaving out a chapter member. Be sure to open emails from mail@phiu.org and national@phiu.org.
