Nearing the end of the school year...

Our Region Councilor team shared their best tips to successfully coast to the end of the school year. We hope these ideas will help you become more confident in your role as chapter advisor.

Tip #1 Create a calendar with tasks and deadlines posted so advisors and chapter officers can view it. Divide large projects, reports, etc. down into small sections so they can have their own deadlines so it is not a massive task at the end of the semester. *Diana Watson-Maile, National Advisor Councilor*

Tip #2 More on planning and calendars! Pencil in all the deliverables and due dates. Give yourself ample time for revisions. Most importantly, leave a little free time to have FUN! Sarah Angne Alfaro, Region 1

Tip #3 Find ways to carve out 5 minutes for self-care each day. Use triage strategies—what can wait to be done even if it is late, what things can be temporarily patched up and what must get done now, or there will be dire consequences. Tip #4 Many officer teams are elected each spring. Make sure each officer transitions with their replacement officer. Upload materials to Greek Track by position so records are permanently archived for future needs. *Martha Rew, Region 3 Councilor*

Tip #5 Divide and Conquer! This is a great time to ask another faculty member to serve as a co-advisor with you. Divide duties around specific interests and promote serving as an organization's advisor is a plus for their resume. Then, follow up to make sure they engage with you and with the chapter. Ask your officers to bring them a simple welcome to Phi U gift! *Mary Gengler, Region 4 Councilor*
